Resource Parent Curriculum (RPC)

Caring for Children Who Have Experienced Trauma: A Virtual Workshop for Resource Parents

WHAT IS RPC?

The Resource Parent Curriculum (RPC) is an 8-session course (16 hours total) that provides support, helpful tips, and tools for parents who are raising children who have experienced trauma, such as abuse and neglect.



WHAT MAKES RPC USEFUL?

Many children or youth who have been in the child welfare system or institutional care have lived through traumatic experiences that affect their behaviors, feelings, and attitudes. A child’s history can make taking care of them challenging and stressful. Although RPC doesn’t have all the answers, deepening your understanding of your child can make parenting less frustrating. RPC connects parents with similar experiences and new insights to support your child’s journey of healing from trauma.

This workshop is FREE, but pre-registration is required and priority will be given to adoptive parents.
