ZERO TO THREE's Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood (DC:0-5™)

The DC:0-5™ (compatible with the DSM-5 and the ICD-10 and IICD-11) is the only developmentally sensitive, multi-axial classification system for diagnosing mental health and developmental disorders in infants and young children. This is a complex process that requires dyadic assessment of caregivers and children, recognition of the different developmental expressions of mental health symptoms, and awareness of cultural considerations.

The current training is for licensed providers only.

Future trainings will be offered for other disciplines working with young children.
