

Become a CARE Facilitator!

2024 REGISTRATION AND TRAINING TIMELINE

MARCH 15, 2024 Registration deadline. Registration taken on a first come, first serve basis.

MARCH 29, 2024 Tuition payment is due in full to CCFH.

Full cost of training is \$1200-\$1400 per trainee. This includes both the morning CARE Training

and afternoon Facilitator Training.

APRIL 1, 2024 CARE Training: 9:00 am - 1:00 pm EST

APRIL I, 2024 CARE Facilitator Training: 1:30 pm - 4:00 pm EST

Facilitate a CARE Training; attend four consultation calls.

REOUIREMENTS

To become a CARE facilitator, participants must:

- Have completed training in at least one of the following evidence-based models:
 - Helping the Non-Compliant Child (HNC)
 - Incredible Years (IY)
 - Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT)
 - Parent Management Training-Oregon Model (PMTO)
- Participate in a half-day CARE training
- Participate in a half-day CARE facilitator training
- Participate in consultation calls following CARE facilitator training
- Facilitate at least 1 CARE training within 1 year of facilitator training

REGISTRATION AND COSTS

- Registration is open until March 15, 2024.
- Limited space available.
- Tuition is \$ \$1,200 for PCIT Trained Clinicians, \$1,400 for IY, PMTO, HNC clinicians. Tuition includes all necessary materials to complete your own CARE training.
